- 2. Choose one of the following passages and discuss what it teaches about the role of all Christians speaking the word of God to others (Matt 28:16-20, Rom 15:14, 1 Cor 10:31-11:1, Eph 4:15-16, Heb 3:12-13, Heb 10:24-25)?
- 3. What should be the goal of every member of the church regardless of their gifting?
- 4. Why do you think it is that there are very few commands in the New Testament to speak the gospel to others?
- 5. Do you agree with the author that, "A Christian without a missionary heart is an anomaly?" Why or why not?
- 6. In what ways are disciples called to be distinctive?
- 7. Explain how the quotation of Penn Jillette (the avowed atheist) impacted your thinking.
- 8. According to the definition on page 39, 'vine work' is when "a Christian brings a truth from God's word to someone else, praying that God would make that word bear fruit through the inward working of his Spirit". Pages 54-56 list a variety of different ways in which all Christians can be involved in vine work. Spend a few minutes coming up with your own list of vine-working possibilities—of different ways and contexts in which a Christian could speak the truth of God to other people (whether to other Christians or to non-Christians).
